Jerry Leiber & Mike Stoller 1960

Jerry Leiber (b. 1933) and Mike Stoller (b. 1933) are among the most influential American songwriters and music producers of popular music. In the 1950s they created a string of hits that Include "Hound Dog", "Kansas City", "Smokey Joe's Cafe", "Riot in Cell Block #9", and "Jailhouse Rock."

They were the first to surround black music with elaborate production values, enhancing its emotional power, as in "There Goes My Baby" and "Stand By Me" and influencing Phil Spector, who apprenticed with them. In the 60's they turned out hit after hit. Their songs from this period include "Charlie Brown," "Searchin"," "Yakety Yak,", "On Broadway and "Ruby Baby". For the Coasters alone, they wrote twenty-four songs that appeared in the national charts. They produced the Shangri-Las' "Leader of the Pack", the Dixie Cupe' "Chapel of Love" and such hugely influential hits as Jay and the Americans' "She Cried", The Exciters' "Tell Him", and The Clovers' "Love Potion #9. In 1969 they wrote the Peggy Lee hit "Is That All There le?". Their last major pop hit was "Stuck in the Middle With You," in 1972.

The meticulous craft and high creativity they brought to rock and roll songwriting was a key influence on the rock and roll songwriters of the '60s, such as Gerry Goffin and Carole King, to the stable of Motown writers. John Lennon and Paul McCartney both discussed the impact that Leiber and Stoller's compositions had on their songwriting. 2010 marks Leiber & Stoller's 60th anniversary as a songwriting team.
